Study Questions

Job study # 6 – *Grace and the Gospel in Job,* Job 42 Series: Riding out the Storms of Life

- 1. Is there ever a time when it's OK to question God? Is there a time when it's NOT OK?
- 2. God's "anger burned" toward the three friends (v. 7). What was their basic offense?
- 3. What are some ways we fall into the same offense?
- 4. God never calls attention to Job's sins as He does his friends'. What is the significance of that?
- 5. Where had Job been wrong in the course of his debate with the friends?
- 6. If God has not called attention to Job's sins, why does he "despise himself and repent in dust and ashes" (v. 6)? What is the nature of his repentance?
- 7. Why did God require the friends to bring sacrifices and ask Job to intercede for them?
- 8. What did this act by his friends require of Job?
- 9. What is the significance of God's restoration of Job not occurring until Job had prayed for his friends?
- 10. Note the areas of Job's restoration.
- 11. Why would God restore Job? Is there a danger of the readers concluding that blessing is indeed the reward of righteousness after all?
- 12. Why is there a DOUBLE restoration?
- 13. What is the significance of Job's daughters being named, and his sons not?
- 14. How has God spoken to you through the book of Job? What is the single most important lesson God wants us to learn from it?
- 15. Identify the ways the gospel is hinted at or symbolized in this story.
